 - Position + Environment + Value
 - Who you are + What you do + Why/How?
 - Is it saying something that is not said elsewhere?
- Summary Strategies
 - Order according to their needs/your greatest strengths—base on job description
 - Use as roadmap to resume—provide specific examples/evidence
 - Avoid Generic—could anyone else in your program write this?
